

The Mimetic Condition: A Transdisciplinary Approach

Keynote: Prof. Gunter Gebauer (Free University of Berlin)

Since the publication of Gunter Gebauer and Christoph Wulf's seminal book *Mimesis: Culture—Art—Society* in 1992, the realization that mimesis is constitutive of the *human condition* has become central to the humanities, the arts, and the social sciences, stretching to inform the hard sciences as well. Furthering Gebauer and Wulf's call to examining the productive aspect of mimesis as a "human condition," the ERC-funded *Homo Mimeticus: Theory and Criticism* (HOM) project (www.homomimeticus.eu) convokes a two-day transdisciplinary workshop at the Institute of Philosophy, KU Leuven, to explore the afterlives of the *mimetic condition* in the twenty-first century. Careful not to impose a unitary perspective to a protean concept, we will be attending to the heterogeneous connections that have been forged since the publication of *Mimesis*, those that remained unexplored by the authors, and those still to be discovered. Disciplines represented include, continental philosophy, performance studies, sociology, literary theory, film studies, science of communication, phenomenology, media studies, theater studies, musicology, among other perspectives.

The two-day workshop is organized by HOM Team members Niki Hadikoesoemo, Daniel Villegas Vélez, Wojciech Kaftanski, and Nidesh Lawtoo and will be hosted by the Husserl Archives. It will consist of seventeen 20-minute papers, a keynote talk by Prof. Gunter Gebauer (Free University of Berlin) and a screening of a video-interview with Prof. Christoph Wulf, co-authors of *Mimesis: Culture, Art, Society* (U. of California Press, 1992).
